When Peter Norman's wife collapsed from heat stroke at the start of December, the kindness of our community was once again on show.



Transitioning into teenagers at Kevin Heinze Grow

Settling into a new year at high school is never easy.

Many students find it challenging to adjust from summer holidays back into the busyness and routine of the school day. Those in senior years may also face pressure deciding what to do after their time at school.

At Kevin Heinze Grow, the Teenage Transition program supports teenagers with disabilities to navigate these challenges. In small groups, supported by a qualified Social Worker, students take part in interesting, creative and therapeutic activities. This is a modified version of the regular Grow program (which caters to school-leavers and adults).

Teenage Transition takes place on weekdays in the peaceful garden setting at Kevin Heinze Grow in Doncaster. The program runs one or two days per week from 3.30pm to 5.30pm. It offers participants a chance to 'get a feel' for their programs and activities.

The program helps develop resilience and encourages well being, social skills, and teamwork to carry over to school and beyond.

Ash Firebrace brightens up Manningham

When you're next visiting the Manningham Civic Centre, you'll find a new addition hanging on the wall.

Painted by Ash Firebrace, we commissioned this work as part of this year's National Reconciliation Week exhibition at Manningham Art Gallery.

Throughout lockdown last year, Ash used a muted black, white and gold colour palette to produce many depictions of Wurundjeri Woi-wurrung ancestral beings and deities in his powerful graphic style.

These formed the large body of work in Ash's exhibition, *Myths and Legends*. He adapted them to feature in this large work where they sit against a vivid orange background. Ash's images capture their subject's form simply, elegantly and joyfully. He adorns them with discrete but intermingling patterns and areas of hatching to convey limbs, feathers, muscles and other features.

While reminiscent of his mural work, the drawings are also an intimate and beguiling glimpse into the artist's working method, cultural heritage and expression of identity.

This work will now be permanently in the Civic Centre foyer and is an attention-commanding articulation of Wurundjeri Woi-wurrung visual culture.

It highlights the significance of Wurundjeri people and culture to the Manningham area historically and into the future. The work is a major contribution to the Manningham Art Collection.

Many thanks to the Ash Firebrace and his sister Michelle Mills, Deltalucille Freedman and the Wurundjeri Woi Wurrung Cultural Heritage Aboriginal Corporation for enabling and assisting with this commission.

Garden waste disposal days to help clean up Bushfire Prone Areas

We are helping residents who live in the Bushfire Prone Area (BPA) to clear their properties. We will place skips at Mullum Mullum Reserve in Donvale on the following weekends:

Saturday 9 and Sunday 10 April

Saturday 9 and Sunday 10 July

📩 Saturday 10 and Sunday 11 September

Saturday 12 and Sunday 13 November

Each household is only allocated one drop off for each month. You can drop off either one car boot, station wagon, ute, or a 6 foot x 4 foot level trailer load of garden waste. We will accept extra garden waste with a charge. You must pay for this via EFT on the day.

Bookings are essential and these events are only available to residents who live in the BPA. You will need to show proof of residency (either a driver's licence or rates' notice) at the check-in point on the day.



To find dates for 2022, check if you are eligible, make a booking or see which items we will and won't accept visit

Extreme weather, a Total Fire Ban or Severe or above Fire Danger Rating may mean we need to cancel disposal days.





COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM NOW OPEN

We're helping not-for-profit groups and organisations to deliver programs and activities to our community through our Community Grants program. Supporting our community is aligned with the goals in our Council Plan and Health and Wellbeing Strategy.

This year we are looking for programs in the following priority areas:

ANNUAL GRANTS

We have three types of annual grants available: Community Development, Arts and Festival and Events.

Applications open Monday 7 February and close Monday 14 March.

Funding: \$3,001 to \$20,000, (our small grants program for less than \$3,000 are awarded in March, June, September and December).

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT GRANTS

Respond to the needs of our diverse communities by bringing them together and strengthening relationships.

ARTS GRANTS

Support activities that provide opportunities to take part in arts, culture and heritage.

FESTIVAL AND EVENT GRANTS

Support community-led festivals and events that attract visitors to key Manningham locations.

SMALL GRANTS

There are two different types of small grants. You can apply for these any time during the year and we will be assessing applications in March, June, September and December.

Stream 1: Community Strengthening

Funding: up to \$3,000

Supports initiatives which bring local communities together and create a better life for Manningham residents.

Stream 2: Equipment Purchase

Funding: up to \$1,500

Supports equipment purchases that will create a better life for Manningham residents. Funding is available for up to 50% of total equipment costs to a maximum of \$1,500.



Our ambitious climate targets for Manningham

With new climate mitigation targets recently adopted by Council, we're ensuring a sustainable future for our community. We're passionate about our responsibility to future generations and the importance of climate action raised at the recent community panel.

The targets adopted by Council were:



Net zero emissions by 2035 for the Manningham community

'Net zero' means achieving a balance between greenhouse gas emissions produced and greenhouse gas emissions taken out of the atmosphere.

These aspirational targets are well ahead of targets that the Victorian and Federal Governments have set. The Victorian State Government has announced community targets for a 45-50% reduction on the 2005 level of emissions by 2030, and net zero by 2050. The Federal Government is working towards net zero by 2050.

We are proud our Council and community are leading the way towards a more sustainable future. These targets will result in significant and wide-ranging benefits for our community.

We've already been busy introducing a range of initiatives to reduce greenhouse gas emissions over the last decade here at Council, including:



Energy efficient streetlights



A low emission Council transport fleet



Solar power



Green power purchasing and a windpowered electricity supply through the Victorian Energy Collaboration (VECO) The new climate mitigation targets will need a range of new actions to reduce Council and community emissions to meet the targets set for 2028 and 2035. All actions are determined based on being best value, economically prudent, environmentally viable and technically proven.

From 2022, the first steps towards achieving the targets will involve considering:



Expanding the VECO program to switch more of Council's electricity accounts across to emissions-free wind-powered electricity



Switching main roads streetlights to energy efficient light emitting diodes (LEDs). We have already upgraded 8,000 streetlights to energy efficient lights including LEDs.

These actions are part of our draft Climate Emergency Action Plan. This plan will go out for community consultation in March 2022 and then formally adopted by Council in mid/late 2022.

WASTE DROP OFF DAY

Saturday 19 February, 8.00am to 4.00pm

Our free Waste Drop Off Day is a chance to get rid of materials that cannot go into your household bins.

You can drop off items such as computers, printers, cables, small electronic toys, paint, household batteries, polystyrene blocks or flattened cardboard.

Limits apply and we can't accept large items such as washing machines, fridges and vacuum cleaners. If you have a Council residential waste service these items are acceptable in a hard waste collection or can be disposed of at a local transfer station.

DETOX YOUR HOME

IN BRIEF

FIRE DANGER PERIOD

The CFA has now declared a Fire Danger Period which started on Monday 10 January and will run into March. A Fire Danger Period is not the same thing as a total fire ban. This is to help prevent fires from starting, especially when weather conditions are hot and dry.

Once the Fire Danger Period has been declared, fire restrictions come into force. This means you cannot light a fire in the open air unless you have a permit or comply with certain requirements.

Make sure you understand your fire risk and know what to do before and during a fire.


