2023/24 Rates at a glance

General Rates

We collect rates from all property owners in the municipality to deliver Council services and programs. Rates support our community through the construction and maintenance of roads, footpaths, facilities, open space and more.

The Victorian Valuer-General is responsible for property valuations and calculates them as at 1 January each year. This year we have an average general rate increase in line with the State Government's rate cap of 3.5 per cent, which is lower than forecast inflation.

Waste Service Charges

For 2023/24 we are capping our waste service charge increases at 4 per cent in Manningham. The Standard Waste Service charge will increase by \$12.50 to \$322.00. This increase is well below the increased cost of waste services for Council.

State Government Fire Services Property Levy

The State Government Fire Services Property Levy is determined annually by the Victorian Government. This levy is passed on in full to help fund the services provided by Fire Rescue Victoria.

How rates are calculated

The method that is used to calculate the Annual Rates is prescribed by the Victorian Government. The rates calculation is based on two variables:

Rate in the dollar

This is the total amount of rate revenue to be raised (\$103.48 million) divided by the value of all properties across the municipality (\$66.62 billion) = 0.00155331 in 2023/24.

Your property value

We must use the Valuer-General's Capital Improved Value (CIV) of your property. This is the market value of the land. buildings and any other improvements.

How properties are valued

The Victorian Valuer-General is responsible for property valuations and calculates them annually as at 1 January each year.

This year, the Valuer-General's work has seen an overall average decrease in property valuations (CIV) of 1.2 per cent within Manningham. The effect has generally seen an average decrease of 1.7 per cent for residential property. Commercial / Industrial properties have a combined average increase of 8.5 per cent.

The movement in individual property values has not been evenly spread across the municipality, which this is reflected in the rates.
