Have your say on footpath upgrades in Warrandyte and Wonga Park



We're holding two public consultation sessions where you can review proposed footpath designs for Warrandyte and Wonga Park. You will have the opportunity to ask us any questions and provide your feedback on the upcoming projects.

Public consultation sessions

Warrandyte Community Hall - Wednesday 29 November, 4.00pm to 8.00pm Wonga Park Hall - Tuesday 5 December, 4.00pm to 8.00pm

The upgrades for Yarra and Dudley roads are part of the Manningham Principal Pedestrian Network (PPN). This footpath network is strategically designed to serve large pedestrian catchments, connecting them to key destinations. They will provide residents with safe and accessible footpaths for outdoor activities, regardless of weather conditions.

Yarra Road, Wonga Park (from 368 Yarra Road to the roundabout at Homestead Road)

We're upgrading the footpath on the eastern side of Yarra Road in 2024. It will connect to the existing path, which continues up the western side of the road via the pedestrian refuge. The proposed footpath will vary between 1.2 and 1.5 metres wide to navigate the surrounding vegetation. It will be made of concrete with an asphalt surface to ensure its durable around the nearby tree roots.

Dudley Road, Wonga Park (from 3 Dudley Road to Wonga Park Primary School)

We're upgrading the existing footpath into a two-metre-wide shared path in 2024. The footpath will be made of concrete with an asphalt surface. It will create a continual connection for walkers and cyclists to the shops, Yarra Road and Wonga Park Primary School, eventually connecting with Jumping Creek Road.

Pound Road, Warrandyte (from Heidelberg-Warrandyte Road to Naughton Avenue)

We're constructing a footpath on the eastern side of the road in 2024. The new path will address community concerns about path safety and will be accessible for everyone to use. We propose using crushed rock or gravel for most of the path, with concrete and an asphalt surface in areas where safety is a concern.

Main Yarra Trail Extension

Stages three and four of the Main Yarra Trail extension project will complete the regional trail connection. The shared trail network will safely and directly connect Warrandyte to Maroondah and Melbourne CBD. It will benefit residents and the broader community by improving active transport options and promoting walking, jogging and cycling.

Stage three – Pound Road to Taroona Avenue, Warrandyte

The third stage of the trail will provide a connection for pedestrians and cyclists between Pound Road and Taroona Avenue. Considering the challenges and environmental limitations of the area, the design proposes for the shared path to run adjacent to the road.

This design will provide convenient access while preserving the surrounding environment. The path will be made of charcoal concrete. It will likely be built in late 2024, subject to necessary approvals.

Stage four – Taroona Avenue, Warrandyte (entire road)

We're upgrading the footpath along the entire road, providing a continual connection for the Main Yarra Trail. Following community feedback, we have amended the design and submitted it to the Registered Aboriginal Party (RAP).

The Wurundjeri re-evaluated the project and want to undertake some further investigations to ensure we are protecting any potential heritage. Pending these investigations, we aim to construct this path in the first half of 2024.
