Victorian Government announces the need for more housing

Victoria's population is expected to reach 10.3 million by 2051, which means 80,000 homes will need to be built each year for the next decade.

Of this housing, 70 per cent will be in established areas of Melbourne, including Manningham. In September, the Victorian Government released Victoria's Housing Statement 2024-2034, a roadmap to improve housing supply and affordability.

This has resulted in some changes to the Manningham Planning Scheme, introduced without consultation with councils or any other peak local government bodies.

Life saving local celebrates 850 blood donations

Templestowe's Murray Burnes recently clocked up an impressive milestone - 850 blood, plasma and platelet donations at Lifeblood's Bundoora Donor Centre.

Murray began donating in 1972, initially to manage his then-chronic nose bleeding. More than 50 years on. his motivation has shifted.

"Reaching 850 donations is a proud achievement and I have no intention of stopping," Murray said.

"I once had an opportunity to meet a person one of my donations saved after an emergency transfusion, and it was so powerful. That moment stays with me as a reminder of the impact blood and plasma donations can have."

"It's encouraging to know that something small I do. goes to helping so many people in a big wav."

More than 33.000 donations are needed across the country every week. 1.200 of which needs to come from the Bundoora donor centre alone. One blood donation can save up to three lives, so Murray has potentially saved an incredible 2,550 lives over the years.

Cancer treatment, emergency surgery, road trauma and bleeding during childbirth are some of the most common uses for donated blood in Australia.

If you've never donated or haven't donated in a while, now is a great time to do so.

Sculptural artwork at Boulevard Hill

A new public artwork by Natasha Johns-Messenger will soon be finished at Boulevard Hill in Ruffey Lake Park, Doncaster.

As part of the Ruffey Lake Park Landscape Masterplan, artists were invited to propose concepts that responded to and reflected the environmental character of Manningham.

Titled 'EclipseViewCircle, 2023', the work will comprise of two polished stainlesssteel forms: a circular structure and an ellipse that frames Ruffey Lake.

Of the artwork, Johns-Messenger said, "Framing Ruffey Lake Park panorama and the changing views, the sculpture encourages contemplation of its surroundings, the intertwining forms designed for both close and distant perspective appreciation."

The artwork is expected to be completed in early 2024.

Batteries contain toxic substances such as cadmium, mercury and lead which can start a fire in your bin, in our collection trucks or at the recycling facility.

Old batteries, whether intact or damaged, also leak toxic chemicals into the environment potentially endangering health and property. Knowing how to correctly dispose of old batteries will help protect you, our contractors and our local environment from fire and contamination risk.

Prepare your home and family for summer

As the weather heats up, it's time to make sure you and your family are prepared in case of an emergency.

TIPS FOR COPING WITH HEAT

- drink plenty of water, even if you don't feel thirsty (if your doctor normally limits your fluids, check how much to drink during hot weather)
- keep vourself cool by using wet towels, putting your feet in cool water and taking cool (not cold) showers
- spend as much time as possible in cool or airconditioned buildings (shopping centres, libraries, cinemas or community centres)
- block out the sun by closing curtains and blinds
- open the windows when there is a cool breeze
- stay out of the sun during the hottest part of the day
- cancel or postpone outings, if you absolutely must go out, stay in the shade and take water with you
- wear a hat and light-coloured, loose-fitting clothing made from natural fibres like cotton and linen
- eat smaller meals more often and cold meals (e.g. salads)
- make sure food that needs refrigeration is properly stored
- avoid heavy activities like sport and gardening
- watch or listen to news reports to find out more information during extreme heat.

MAKE SURE YOU UNDERSTAND THE FIRE **DANGER RATINGS**

There is a national Fire Danger Rating System, with four levels of fire danger:

- 1. Moderate plan and prepare
- 2. High be ready to act
- 3. Extreme take action now to protect your life and property
- 4. Catastrophic for your survival, leave bushfire risk areas

Fire Danger Ratings will be issued on days when there is a fire risk. If the Fire Danger Rating is Extreme or above, or if it is a day of Total Fire Ban, it is not safe to be at a park or reserve.

Be prepared during the summer months and check the Fire Danger Rating each day. Some reserves may be closed, so plan accordingly.

PREPARE YOUR EMERGENCY PLAN

Is your emergency plan written down, shared and practised with your family, neighbours and pets? To ensure you're prepared:

- have a written copy of your plan quickly accessible in your home and a backup copy on your mobile or smart device
- develop your plan with everyone in your household and include your neighbours
- regularly review and practise your plan with your family and neighbours
- have a back-up plan in case circumstances change.

HAVE A BACKUP PLAN

Fires are unpredictable and it's important to remember that home emergency plans can fail. Having a backup plan that identifies your shelter or last resort options may save your life if you are caught in a fire.

CONNECT WITH YOUR NEIGHBOURS

Discuss your emergency plans with your neighbours and talk about how you can support each other. Identify and connect with neighbours who may need help planning for an emergency and ask how you may be able to assist. PREPARE YOUR PROPERTY

You can reduce the risk bushfires pose to your home and family by removing overgrown vegetation from your property. The Manningham Planning Scheme includes controls about removal of vegetation, particularly native vegetation, and we can help you navigate them.

FIRE HAZARD INSPECTION PROGRAM

Every year as our fire season approaches, we inspect properties within areas of bushfire risk. In partnership with Country Fire Authority and Fire Rescue Victoria, we want to be proactive and engage with you to create a safer and more resilient community.

Over 5,500 properties in Manningham fall within the Bushfire Management Overlay (BMO). If this is you, you will have received a letter on how to prepare for the 2023-24 Fire Danger period, including:

- tips for preparing your property to reduce bushfire and grassfire risk
- where you can dispose of green waste

an explanation of what a Fire Prevention Notice is and possible costs associated with the infrinaement.

NEIGHBOURHOOD SAFER PLACES

A Neighbourhood Safer Place (also known as a Bushfire Place of Last Resort or NSP-BPLR) is a place of last resort when all other bushfire plans have failed.

Neighbourhood Safer Places are not:

- **X** an alternative to planning to leave early or to stay and defend your property - they are a place of last resort if all other fire plans have failed
- X to be confused with Community Fire Refuges, Relief Centres, Recovery Centres or Assembly Areas, each of which have a different and specific purpose
- **X** an appropriate destination when leaving the area early
- **X** a place of shelter from other types of emergencies events).

Manningham's three NSPs are all outdoor and are located at:

- Park Orchards: Domeney Pavilion Verandah 24-52 Knees Road
- Wonga Park: Dudley Reserve, Dudley Road
- Warrandyte: Skate Park and Basketball Courts Taroona Avenue

A NEW MUNICIPAL FIRE MANAGEMENT PLAN


Our new Municipal Fire Management Plan contains arrangements about preparedness for and mitigation of fire risks. We work with our emergency service partners and the community to ensure Manningham is prepared and resilient to the risk associated with fire.

Water for our wildlife

Just like us, our local birds, insects and wildlife need extra water in hot and dry weather. To help our native animals, consider leaving water out in your garden.

The best containers to use are shallow bowls or plastic pot plant bases. Place a rock in the middle of larger bowls (emerging from the water), to allow birds to perch while drinking.

Find a spot that isn't too exposed, offers some shade and is well above ground level, away from pets.

In bushland areas, place another bowl at ground level for ground dwelling animals such as echidnas and blue-tongue lizards.

When watering in hot weather, spraying water into the foliage provides moisture for the birds and also helps attract insects for them to eat.

If you are trying to attract small birds to your garden. planting native shrubs is the best option. It's best not to put any food out for wild birds or animals as they all have special diets. Feeding them bread or other food can be harmful.

Keeping our pets safe from snakes

Do you know which vets stock antivenom for the snakes in your area?

Not all vets stock antivenom to treat snake bites. Knowing where the nearest vet to you is will save precious time if your cat or dog is bitten by a venomous snake.

Australia has some of the world's deadliest snake species and it's not only people they can pose a threat to. As the weather warms up, our native snakes are more active in reserves and on private properties. One of the most serious emergencies cat and dog owners face is our pets being bitten by a venomous snake.

If you suspect your pet might have been bitten by a snake, act quickly and seek medical advice from a vet to give them the best chance of survival.

Supporting our community interests around the North East Link Program

With the North East Link Program (NELP) underway, we're continuing to represent community interests and advocate for Manningham.

We recognise the project will have a significant impact on our community, both positive and adverse. We're working to ensure that any adverse impacts are mitigated, as far as practicable, and are strongly advocating for an overall community benefit.

To date, we've undertaken significant strategic work and advocacy, including contributing to the:

- North East Link Environment Effects Statement (EES)
- Judicial Review
- Urban Design Landscape Plan (UDLP) for the Central (Tunnels) Package
- UDLP for the Eastern Freeway Upgrades

We've also reviewed more than 160 design reports and approved more than 400 Traffic Management Plans for construction work. Our Parks team has undertaken a comprehensive tree planting program to offset future impacts to vegetation.

In recent months, we've heard from community members regarding their concerns about the impacts of NELP construction. This includes, but is not limited to. issues of noise, dust, vibrations and road disruptions.

We'll continue to raise concerns on behalf of our community and work with NELP to enhance communication with the locally affected community.

We'll keep working diligently alongside the NELP team and State Government on all aspects of the project as construction progresses.

Councillor Deirdre Diamante, has met with local MPs and written to the Minister for Transport Infrastructure, on behalf of the Council and community. Cr Diamante highlighted growing concerns from the Manningham community as NELP construction continues to increase.

ADVOCATING FOR OUR COMMUNITY

We've achieved many positive outcomes and delivery of community facilities, as a result of ongoing advocacy and contribution to the planning of the project. These include:

- a redevelopment and masterplan for Bulleen Park (AFL / cricket)
- new soccer facilities (three pitches and pavilion) at Templestowe Road, Bulleen
- a new pedestrian/cycling bridge at Banksia Park (Bulleen) across the Yarra River
- a new Bulleen Park & Ride facility to support the Doncaster Busway
- protection of the 300+ year old River Red Gum tree in Bulleen
- negotiating to plan for surplus land at the former Bulleen Industrial Precinct to support a future employment precinct at this location
- a commitment to undertake a business case to duplicate Templestowe Road and include walking and cycling facilities.

Si Canta Per Vivere, Si Vive Per Cantare -We Sing to Live, We Live to Sing

The halls of the Veneto Club in Bulleen reverberate with song as the 28 members of the Veneto Club Choir get warmed up on Thursday evenings.

Ranging in age from their thirties to 90-years-old (with an average age of 80). the male choir has been coming together to sing in both Italian and English for more than five years.

As the oldest member, Tarcisio Meneghetti says the choir keeps him young. "I enjoy getting out of the house and singing with the choir. I enjoy the friendship and being with men I've known for years. Although I'm 90 years old, singing in the choir makes me feel young."

Members of the choir are mainly of Italian background and have loved singing since childhood and love to perform with gusto and vitality. However, there's much more than a love of performance shared.

Together, the choir has performed at Manningham Carols by Candlelight, Queen Victoria Night Market, Preston Market Italian Day, Melbourne Italian Festival, Mirboo North Italian Festa, the Wonthaggi Polenta Festival, as well as regular performances at the Veneto Club and aged care facilities locally.

Pasquale Marinelli says the choir has given him many new friends and acquaintances.

"They would have escaped me if I would have stayed at home. Managing and singing in the choir gives me a lot of satisfaction. I'm constantly singing our songs - in the garden, in front of my computer, when I'm preparing dinner - no, I don't sing in the shower! This singing just lightens my day and keeps me from thinking about our daily little (and at times big) problems mainly related to our declining health."

Recent addition, Joe Peruzzi, joined with his father Giuseppe. He was looking for an activity the two could do together.

Joy says "Participating in the choir gives me the opportunity to engage with so many people in this varied and welcoming group. The joy and enthusiasm for the songs really lifts me up, and it is a unique and inspiring experience that we're able to share."
