Victoria Street Playground closed for improvements

We're upgrading one of our most loved playgrounds, Victoria Street Playground in Ruffey Lake Park.

You'll soon enjoy a giant basket swing, lookout tower and slide, rope balance circuit, and an all-abilities spinner. We're also expanding the sand and water play area and adding more seating and plants.

The playground and a small part of the carpark will remain closed until mid-year while we complete the works. Works will mostly happen on weekdays.

Toilets, picnic shelters and the flying fox at the playground will remain open.

Other playgrounds at Ruffey Lake Park are still open. Check out playspaces at The Boulevard or Church Road North. Older kids looking for a challenge can have a go at the Ninja Warrior Course at the northern end of The Boulevard (off King Street).

If you're looking for similar playgrounds to visit, try Wombat Bend in Templestowe Lower or wongium wilam in Warrandyte.

Have your say on the future of housing in Manningham

Here in Manningham, we're lucky to have a unique range of urban and leafy suburbs, rural lifestyle areas and vibrant activity centres.

Our community is also growing. Over the next 12 years, our population is expected to increase by around 18,000 people, to more than 144,000 people. This means we'll need close to 8,000 new homes across Manningham.

As our community changes, we need to plan for a range of homes that cater for different needs and life stages. We also need to carefully plan the location of future housing to support the affordability, sustainability and character of our suburbs.

That's why we're updating the Manningham Residential Strategy.

The first stage in developing the new strategy is the preparation of our Residential Discussion Paper.

The Residential Discussion Paper identifies four themes to underpin our housing future:

- 1 Location and connectedness
- 2 Housing design quality
- 3 Neighbourhood character
- 4 Housing choice, diversity and affordability

These themes will set the foundation for how we manage growth and work together as a Council and community to achieve desired outcomes for all.

You're invited to provide feedback on the Residential Discussion Paper when consultation opens on Monday 8 April.

We want to hear your insights, priorities and ideas around housing and neighbourhood character.

Keeping our roads safe and smooth

Have you ever wondered why we use different treatments to fix our roads? There are two ways we might fix a road – resurfacing or rehabilitation (reconstructing).

Both of these processes renew the life of our roads. They can stop cracks, joints, depressions and potholes for up to 40 years. They also allow us to create a smooth surface to prevent more water from getting in.

When we resurface roads, we remove some of the road and replace it with a fresh surface. We use this process when the surface has started showing signs of deterioration, allowing water penetration, but the pavement underneath is still sound.

Rehabilitated roads require deeper works. This ranges from 100mm and deeper (often up to 600mm) and can depend on the road traffic and quality of the pavement underneath. We can identify a road that needs rehabilitation by crack patterns and through geotechnical investigations.

Either way, both repair methods look and operate like brand new roads.

HOW DO WE DECIDE WHICH ROADS WE RESURFACE OR RECONSTRUCT?

Our *Road Management Plan* outlines the process we use to identify priority roads for repair and the type of repair they need.

We look at factors that affect the longevity of resurfacing. This could include:

- how many vehicles and heavy vehicles use the road
- tree roots
- slope
- amount of rain
- services under the road
- the construction methods used when it was first built.

We then decide which treatment is most suitable.

INSPECTING OF OUR ROADS

We regularly do both reactive and proactive inspections.

Reactive inspections happen when we see a road needing excessive patching or when we receive a request about a pothole developing.

We also engage independent contractors to conduct proactive inspections every four years or so.

They will scan, photograph and video our roads to check the length and number of cracks and look at crack patterns to give a score for each element.

Scores are then used to identify which are best suited for our resurfacing program, then we will assign contractors to repair these roads.

USING RECYCLED MATERIALS ON OUR ROADS

Did you know all resurfaced roads in Manningham contain 30 to 40 per cent recycled materials?

Sometimes we add crumbed rubber (recycled rubber from tyres), recycled crushed glass, printer toner or recycled aggregate among other products.

The road mix is always changing and we continue to work to find new ways to add recycled materials and improve our surfaces.

Rich and differing First Nations materials and processes are deployed along with key tenants of Western Abstraction, offering conceptual and immediate encounters with paint and form.

karu kin is a special project led by Manningham resident, Grace Dlabik. Connecting indigenous women and non-binary folk through clay making using memory, embodiment, nurture, nourishment, and connection. *karu kin* invites you to view the cyclical nature of the materials used in this project, from raw clay, and traditional practices, to shared experiences within community.

Wednesday 28 August to Saturday 12 October *Moustachioed Women and Rhinoplastic Girls*

Iranian-Australian artist Ramak Bamzar seeks to enter a deeper understanding of the culture and behaviour of women in the Middle East and uses social media as a source to inspire the creation of staged portraits of contemporary Iranian women.

Wednesday 2 October to Saturday 16 November *Making Matter*

Lara Chamas is a first-generation Australian-Lebanese artist. Through storytelling, trans generational trauma and memory and tacit knowledge, a set of hand made and cast objects explores links and meeting points between narrative theory, cultural practice, current political and societal tensions, and the body as a political vessel.

Wednesday 23 October to Saturday 14 December 2024 *Sequence Unseen: New Acquisitions*

A curated series of recent acquisitions to the Manningham Art Collection, exploring unseen stories and perspectives through contemporary artistic practices. Artists include Atong Atem, Richard Young, Jade Plitz, Rhys Cousins and Grace Dlabik, amongst others.

Have you seen our new robotic lawn mower working around Manningham?

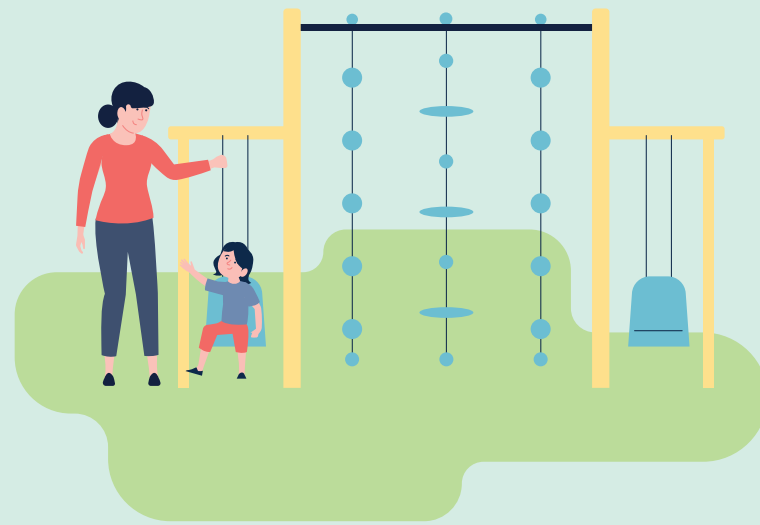
Battery powered and remote controlled, the new addition is innovative, environmentally friendly and practical. It's compact and light weight, allowing it to manage a variety of terrains. It can get up steep slopes, avoid unexpected objects and lets staff know when something is blocking its path.

This makes it the smarter choice for hard to reach embankments, soft ground or hazardous areas, which in the past were hard for conventional mowers or tractor slasher equipment to reach.

With its cutting-edge technology, the mower is already in high demand and you'll see it out around Manningham this autumn.



The latest exciting improvements to our parks and public spaces



TED AJANI RESERVE

We've upgraded the playspace, added exercise equipment and improved the landscaping.

There's also a sports court, bike track, picnic shelter, table, and extra seating (pictured left).

We've been busily upgrading parks, reserves, playspaces and recreation facilities across Manningham.

These improvements reflect our commitment to providing accessible areas for recreation, leisure, and relaxation.

The quality and condition of many of these community spaces are ensured through our 10-year Parks Improvement Program, which prioritises locations for upgrades and renewals.

Other upgrades were made possible through partnerships with the Victorian Government.

DEEP CREEK RESERVE BASEBALL PAVILION

The pavilion has been redeveloped - with upgrades to the change rooms, added social space, a new kiosk, extra storage and umpire change rooms.

This upgrade was delivered in partnership with the Victorian Government and Doncaster Baseball Club.



PARK ORCHARDS TENNIS CLUB

You'll find upgraded surfaces (pictured right) and upgraded fencing.

DONVALE TENNIS CLUB

Courts five, six, nine and 10 have been resurfaced. We've also installed floodlights and upgraded fencing.

CAT JUMP PARK

Enjoy an upgraded playspace, improved landscaping and a new multipurpose activity court.

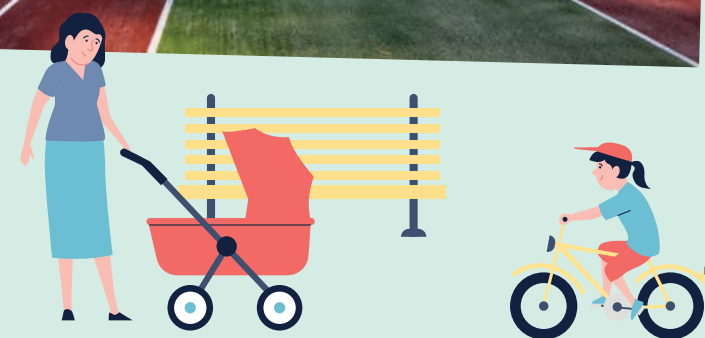
It features a rebound wall, basketball and netball half courts, as well as a new fitness hub.



KOONUNG PARK PUBLIC COURTS

We've upgraded the three community courts to include a new multi-use basketball and futsal court (pictured right) and two upgraded tennis courts.

There's new floodlights, fencing, new gates and an online Book-a-Court system.



DONVALE RESERVE

The cricket net training facility now has an extra five bays. They have retractable netting, storage, and accessible pathworks (pictured left).

Power has been added for bowling machines, and there's LED floodlighting for three soccer pitches and an Australian Rules field.

We've also upgraded floodlighting at four other locations - Ted Ajani Reserve, Rieschiecks Reserve, Serpells Reserve and Timber Reserve.
