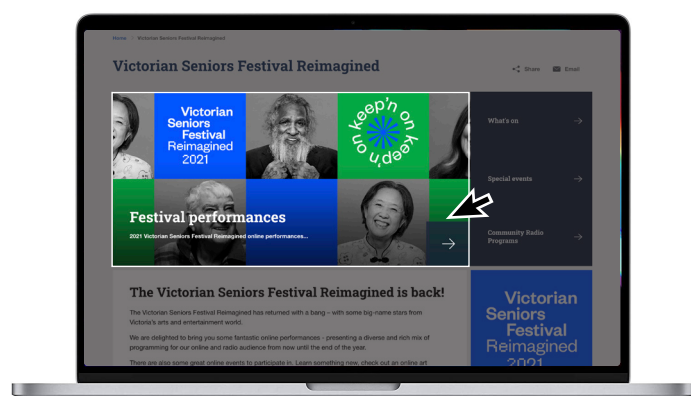
We are proud to present special programs to enjoy online, with new performances added every month through to December 2021.

We were inspired to produce these creative programs that express continuity, optimism for the future, learnings from generation to generation, and the joy of pure performance.

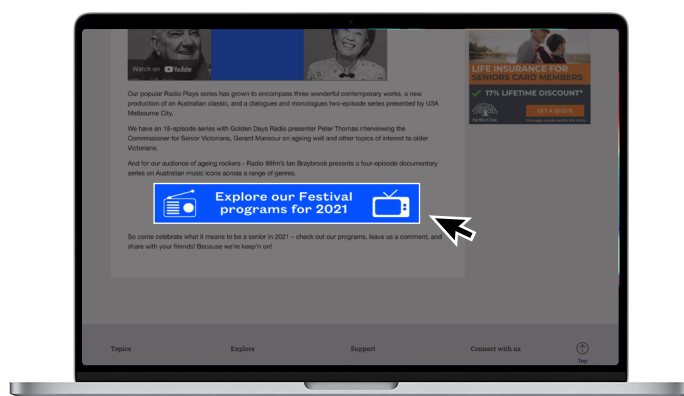

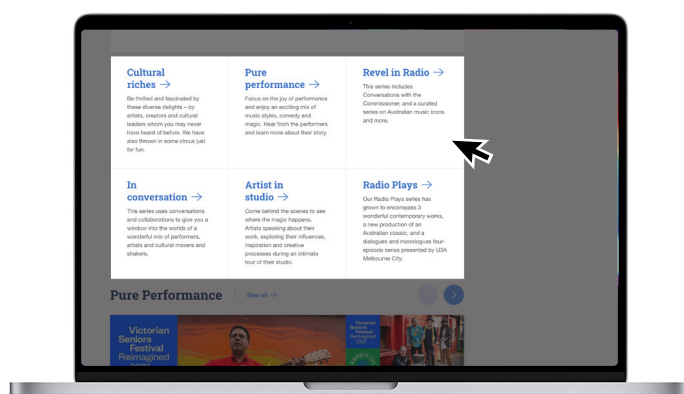
